

Norwegian Aviation Museum

The Norwegian Aviation Museum opened in 1994 and is a national museum for aviation history. The museum is located in a building shaped like a giant propeller, and covers military and civil aviation history from the first flimsy flying machines made from canvas, wire and bamboo to today's jumbo jets that cross oceans and continents in hours. It is the story of record-breaking achievements and pioneering heroes, of success and failure, and of the importance of aviation in the development of modern-day Norway. The museum offers school children a fantastic hands-on, interactive experience!

The Norwegian Aviation Museum is the largest of its kind in Scandinavia, and the collection is the result of years of painstaking restoration and research. The work is carried out by aviation experts in collaboration with amateur enthusiasts throughout Norway.
